Once you have received your details you will be able to either download the app or access via the RM Easimaths website and your child will have access to a maths programme to work through from home. This will be optional home learning but the programme is a very good way for children to practise and reinforce skills they have learnt in school as well as gain new skills. Please try your best not to help your child with the activities – the questions are read for your child and they should be able to have a go at selecting or typing the answer. The programme will adjust the level accordingly so it is important that you try not to help them answer the questions. There will be a parent questionnaire towards the end of the summer term to see how you have got on with the programme and whether your child has enjoyed it!
